The seminar is particularly timely, as it will be held at such a point when both the LGA and the Home Office are reviewing their respective non statutory and statutory guidance in this area, and will of course be invited to address delegates with an update. Other speakers will include land managers, dog walkers, the Met Police, and colleagues from with local authorities with PSPO implementation experience (good and bad)!

Each of the sessions during the seminar will be interactive, in order that everybody invited is able to participate and add to discussions as they wish to.

The seminar is aimed at those who may be considering introducing Public Spaces Protection Orders, or who have already done so, or those looking for assistance in dealing with irresponsible dog owners.
